The program offers conservation related benefits such as windbreaks, buffers and reforestation. Availability of species is based on nursery inventory and may be subject to change. Orders can be placed by submitting this form to the Raisin Region Conservation Authority by mail or by email.

**To secure your 2020 order, please submit your application by March 31, 2020.**

CONDITIONS OF ORDERING:

1. Orders must be in multiples of 10 per species.
2. Orders are subject to a \$20 handling fee plus applicable taxes and must be paid in full at the time of order
3. Applicants are responsible for the pick-up of trees. A location, date and time will be designated by the RRCA. Details will be sent via email and posted on the RRCA website [www.rrca.on.ca](http://www.rrca.on.ca)
4. Applicants are responsible for the planting and care necessary for survival including adequate protection from animals.
5. Due to environmental conditions beyond our control, the RRCA assume no responsibility for the survival rates of the trees.

| Conifer Trees         | Code | Description  | Quantity | Cost | Amount |

| Eastern White Pine    | Pw   | -Best in larger reforestation areas. Sensitive to salt.  |          | 0.95 |        |
| Red Pine              | Pr   | -Tolerates poor, rocky, sandy soil. Sensitive to salt.   |          | 0.90 |        |
| White Spruce          | Sw   | -Excellent windbreak tree. Grows in a nice compact shape.  |          | 1.20 |        |
| Norway Spruce         | Sn   | -Excellent windbreak tree and fast growing.  |          | 0.95 |        |
| Eastern White Cedar   | Ce   | -Tolerates many soil types. Dense foliage from ground up.  |          | 1.20 |        |
| Balsam Fir            | Bf   | -Tolerates many soil types and different moisture levels.  |          | 1.60 |        |
| Tamarack              | La   | -Needles drop in winter. Prefers wet, poorly drained sites.  |          | 1.35 |        |
| Deciduous Trees       | Code | Description  | Quantity | Cost | Amount |
| Black Walnut          | Wb   | -Likes well drained, fertile soil. Excellent lumber and wildlife tree.   |          | 1.50 |        |
| Silver Maple          | Ms   | -Prefers moist soil. It is a large tree. Needs room to grow.   |          | 1.25 |        |
| Red Maple             | Mr   | -Tolerates many soil types. Root system can affect tile drains.  |          | 1.50 |        |
| Hard (Sugar) Maple    | Mh   | -Shade tree with strong branches and sensitive to salt.  |          | 1.80 |        |
| White Oak             | Ow   | -Tolerates many soil types. Bark is whitish to pale gray, usually with long scales. Should not be planted close to septic tanks or drainage tiles.   |          | 1.50 |        |
| Bur Oak               | Ob   | -Tolerates many soil types. Excellent wildlife tree.   |          | 1.50 |        |
| Red Oak               | Or   | -Tolerates many soil types. Needs room to grow.  |          | 1.50 |        |
| Butternut             | Bn   | -Needs full sun to grow and will not live in the shade. Grow best in rich soil with good drainage  |          | 2.10 |        |
| Bitternut Hickory     | Hb   | -Prefers deep, moist well-drained soils. Spring transplant only.   |          | 2.50 |        |
| Tulip Tree            | Tt   | -Plant in spring to early fall, full sun location, on moist, well-drained, compost-amended soil. Avoid hot, dry sites. Plant at least 40 feet apart. |          | 1.50 |        |
| White Birch           | Bw   | -Tolerates many soil types. Leaves are egg-shaped or triangular in shape. Prefers full sun.  |          | 1.80 |        |
| Yellow Birch          | By   | -Prefers moist soil. Medium-sized tree.  |          | 1.80 |        |
| Deciduous Shrubs      | Code | Description  | Quantity | Cost | Amount |
| Common Lilac          | Lc   | - Prefers full sun, dry to medium well-drained soil. Dislikes acidic soil. Easy to grown, tough as nails and deer resistant.                         |          | 1.50 |        |
| Service Berry         | Sask | -Tolerates wet sites and transplants easily. Fruits are edible.  |          | 2.30 |        |
| Highbush Cranberry    | Ch   | -Prefers moist well-drained soil. Has pretty white blossoms in late spring followed by large clusters of bright red berries by the end of summer.    |          | 1.50 |        |
| Chokeberry            | Bc   | -Prefers well-drained soil. Flowers in May and fruit is ripe in mid August. Its dense growth is ideal for reducing wind near ground surface.         |          | 1.90 |        |
| Chokecherry           | Cc   | - Prefers full sun, will tolerate shade. Prefers rich, well-drained soil. Good food source for birds and larger mammals.                             |          | 1.90 |        |
| Black Elderberry      | Eb   | -Requires fertile, well-drained soil and full or partial sun. Fruit should always be cooked prior to eating.   |          | 2.40 |        |
| Nannyberry            | Nb   | -Prefers medium moisture, well-drained soils. Proven to be tolerant of heat, drought, and performs well in the urban landscape.                      |          | 1.20 |        |
