

2023 Tree Seedling Application Form

The Tree Seedling Program is available to all landowners in the Raisin Region Conservation Authority watershed area. The program offers conservation related benefits such as windbreaks, buffers and reforestation. Availability of species is based on nursery inventory and may be subject to change. Orders can be placed by submitting this form to the Raisin Region Conservation Authority by mail or by email.

To secure your 2023 order, please submit your application by March 31, 2023.

CONDITIONS OF ORDERING:

- 1. Orders must be in multiples of 10 per species.
- 2. Orders are subject to a \$20 handling fee plus applicable taxes and must be paid in full at the time of order. A \$10 re-stocking fee will be charged on any return of tree aids.
- 3. Applicants are responsible for the pick-up of trees. A location, date and time will be designated by the RRCA.

- 4. Applicants are responsible for the planting and care necessary for survival including adequate protection from animals.
- 5. Due to environmental conditions beyond our control, the RRCA assume no responsibility for the survival rates of the trees.

Tulip Tree	Tt	-Plant in spring to early fall, full sun location, on moist, well-drained, compost-amended soil. Avoid hot, dry sites. Plant at least 40 feet apart.		2.35	
White Birch	Bw	-Tolerates many soil types. Leaves are egg-shaped or triangular in shape. Prefers full sun.		2.30	
Black Cherry	Cb	-Tolerates many soil types. Not drought-tolerant. Full sun is ideal. Begins to bear edible fruit 3-4 years after planting. Blooms early with clusters white flower		2.55

Common Lilac	Lc	- Prefers full sun, dry to medium well-drained soil. Dislikes acidic soil. Easy to grown, tough as nails and deer resistant.		2.15

Black Chokecherry	Сс	- Prefers full sun, will tolerate shade. Prefers rich, well-drained soil. Good food source for birds and larger mammals.		2.35
